[00:26:30] mandatory 24 hour sensory retreat building. I registered for a room by myself and the other two are rooming in the other room in the suite. I get an email saying roommate will be my roommate and they want to meet up.

[00:26:45] I agree. The roommate responded with a block schedule 2. 5 weeks in advance from then with the quote pick a time. Oh, okay. I saw the name attached to the email and recognize that this person currently has serious allegations

[00:27:00] against them and is well known all over campus. I wanted to be fair, so I made a time. I wound up running 15 minutes late, texted a guy I would be

running a few minutes late, and asked if we could still meet up. Got a reply saying, quote, Nah, what are you

[00:27:15] doing next Wednesday? Said nothing, I'm free, and was left on read. Before Wednesday, I met with this current roommate and he described him to me. Said the guy scares him, he feels uncomfortable around him, they are not on speaking terms, which didn't make me feel any more hopeful.

[00:29:00] “find” him a room as that's an RA job. He then responded, we will see, to my original message telling him about my situation. I sent him rooms listed in the same building on the floor above us as empty. I've been left on read for over a week. Am I the a hole?

[00:29:15] Run! What is this? Yeah. Allegations? No, as soon as I heard allegations, I genuinely was like, Alright, we're done here wrap it up. But, yeah I don't think you're the a hole. I

[00:29:30] also think you tried your best to rectify the situation by literally giving him rooms. I think he just wasn't expecting that. Or, I don't know if it's a he, but, I just, yeah. Literally, I was like, it sounds like a man. But yeah,
